



Balangan & Dreamland

A beautiful secluded cove and beach, Balangan features a usually soft left that breaks off a lava stone headland that runs towards the beach. On most days, Balangan's waves are fast and provide a speed run section. The best are during certain mid tide days. An A-frame peak break, the Dreamland offers a short right-hander and a longer left.

The Bingin

Bingin is not a long-wave-ride, but it is famous for its consistent and finely-tuned barrels.

Impossible & Padang-Padang

The Impossible reef shows three definite peaks; one that walls, barrels and cracks; a middle section that can line up until the final end section; and the end section. The best time to visit Padang-Padang is around mid tide when its peaks challenge only the most skilled surfers.

Uluwatu

Uluwatu's waves were first discovered in the early 1970s. The left point break at Uluwatu is considered Bali's original and most famous surf proving ground.

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SURFING IN JAVA

West Java

Two of West Java's three primary and special surfing destinations are located on the beautiful but ragged southern coast where the wind-lashed Indian Ocean kisses black-sand beaches.

Pelabuhan Ratu

Around 50 km south of Bogor, Pelabuhan Ratu is a popular seaside resort on the south coast due to its relatively easy accessibility. Leaving the toll expressway, the road passes through hilly country and plantations. Despite strong undertow and surf, Pelabuhan Ratu welcomes a growing number of surfers from Jakarta.

Ujung Genteng

Further south and another 65 km from Pelabuhan Ratu, the peninsular area called Ujung Genteng offers exciting surfing options.

Panaitan Island

Lying in the middle of the Sunda Strait, the island faces and is part of the





Ujung Kulon National Park, home of the Javan one-horned rhino. It takes about four hours to reach the island by boat from Labuan on Java's western coast and gateway to the park and other offshore islands, including the volcano, Anak Krakatau. Panaitan is about 17,500 hectares large with a sheer cliff overlooking a little bay, strewn with rocks and continuously pounded by waves.

East Java

Until recently, East Java's attractions were focused on dry land. There's smoldering mountains, jungles and ancient monuments - to name a few. The discovery of a new surfing haven on the southeastern coast of Java further establishes the region as an exciting destination for adventure. As well as having the perfect wave, it is borders two of Java's great national parks, Meru Betiri and Alas Purwo.

Grajagan (G-Land)

Grajagan on Java's easternmost point is acknowledged as the prime surfing destination. Like most waves in Indonesia, G-Land is a long fast wave and powerful.
